



Expanded Program for the Education and Enrichment of Relationship Skills (PEERS)



The program is offered at convenient locations throughout Toronto at no cost and free child care is provided for siblings.



Thanks to Geneva Centre for Autism for helping us to create "Pablo's World", a soothing space where kids and families could experience our day in a different way.






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## **Behind the Scenes: Professional Training**


